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## Cerumen removal: two codes

69209 Removal impacted cerumen using irrigation/lavage, unilateral

- Service performed by staff member
- No work RVUs

69210 Removal impacted cerumen requiring instrumentation, unilateral

Service performed by physician/NP/PA with instrumentation

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### Cerumen removal: two codes

69209 Removal impacted cerumen using irrigation/lavage, unilateral 69210 Removal impacted cerumen requiring instrumentation, unilateral

- Per CPT, you may not bill both of these codes on the same day
- CMS does not pay them as bilateral codes

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# Medical necessity

#### Any one of the four criteria meet the necessity

- Visual considerations: Cerumen impairs exam of clinically significant portions of the external auditory canal, tympanic membrane, or middle ear condition.
- Qualitative considerations: Extremely hard, dry, irritative cerumen causing symptoms such as pain, itching, hearing loss, etc.
- Inflammatory considerations: Associated with foul odor, infection, or dermatitis.
- Quantitative considerations: Obstructive, copious cerumen that cannot be removed <u>without magnification and multiple instrumentations</u> requiring physician skills.

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## Cerumen removal

- May be billed on the same day as an E/M service when it meets the description of a significant, separate service
- If patient is scheduled for cerumen removal, do not bill an E/M service

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# Yes, you can be paid

• If the nurse removes impacted cerumen with lavage
